

#### Legal Stance

The law on compulsory collective worship was first introduced by Section 25 of the Education Act 1944. The legislation was subsequently developed by the Education Reform Act 1988, by Chapter III of the Education Act 1996, and, most recently, by the School Standards and Framework Act 1998.

Currently, all state schools are legally required to provide an act of "collective worship" that is "broadly Christian" every day.

Church of England Schools are expected to provide collective worship that is Christian in nature and reflects the school's vision and Christian foundation – as inspected by the SIAMS Framework Sept 2023.






#### **Advice**

Under the law, parents can request for their children aged under 16 to be withdrawn "wholly or partly" from acts of collective worship.

The school needs to supervise the child but not provide an alternative provision – parents of other faiths may provide their own material for their children to study in this time.

#### **Collective Worship Information**

#### Q: Do all state-funded schools need to provide a daily act of collective worship?

A: Yes, all state-funded schools are required to provide a daily act of collective worship for pupils aged between 5 to 18 years, through legislation<sup>1</sup> for maintained schools or their funding agreements for academies.

#### Q. Which state-funded schools need to provide collective worship that is of a broadly Christian character?

A: Maintained schools and academies without a religious designation – sometimes called non-faith schools – are required to provide collective worship that is wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character, which means that it "reflects the broad traditions of Christian belief without being distinctive of any particular Christian denomination"<sup>2</sup>.

Such schools may apply for an exemption from the requirement to provide broadly Christian collective worship if they consider that this would better meet the needs of their pupils/community.

TRINITY SUNDAY (26 MAY 2024)







#### WHAT IS TRINITY SUNDAY?

- First Sunday after Pentecost
- Celebrates the perfect community of Father/ Son/ Holy Spirit

 Different to Pentecost as that is about the work of the Holy Spirit and Trinity Sunday is about the relationship of the Holy Spirit with God and Jesus (three – in-one).

Liturgical colour is White/Gold

Psalm 95 is traditionally used





#### IQ3 How is collective worship enabling pupils and adults to flourish spiritually?


- a) How do the theologically rooted Christian vision and the Anglican/Methodist foundation of the school shape worship and spirituality in the school? Vision shaping worship
- b) How do partnerships with the DBE and/or MAST, and partnerships with parish/local church/es enhance this? Partnerships enhancing worship and making it meaningful
- c) In what ways is the worship life of the school inclusive, invitational, and inspirational? Worship being for everyone
- d) In the context of the school as a Church school, what do pupils and adults understand to be the meaning of spirituality and spiritual development? How does this enhance and enrich collective worship and individuals' spiritual development? Worship being a place to stop, think, reflect, be curious, ask questions and for some pray





#### Setting the scene – Only what is in IQ3?

- 'Pupils leading worship' park that point from previous SIAMS
- No specific reference to the Trinity/Eucharist/Lord's Prayer
- SIAMS reports are focusing on listing provision, many are not answering the IQ
- This suggests evidence gathering is not focused on impact



Your evidence need to answer IQ3 How is collective worship enabling pupils and adults to flourish spiritually?

- Sub-questions guide your thinking and help you to prepare for SIAMS.
- Key to answering the IQ is d) what do pupils and adults understand to be the meaning of spirituality, in the context of being a Church school?
- How do you establish that? How do you show evidence of this?



#### Building your evidence base







IMPACT over time – the inspector seeks typicality, and the way worship influences the lives of those attending.





#### Inspectors need to be satisfied that the following is understood and met:

Name of training: NEW for 2024-25: Understanding and Developing Collective Worship to Enable Spiritual Flourishing

#### **Presenter: Chris Allen**

Collective Worship is a fundamental part of the spiritual development of pupils and adults in church schools. The expectation of SIAMS is that the impact of daily collective worship is everybody grows spiritually. How this is achieved and how this is monitored are two area that will be explored on this half day course. The course will unpack what is considered to be spiritual development in Collective worship and how this is different to spirituality in other aspects of school life. It will look at a range of resources to support the delivery of collective worship to enable spiritual development. It will also consider how to evidence spiritual flourishing for a SIAMS inspection in your school.


